What you have said	Action taken
You have stated that Anti-Social Behaviour is a concern, incidents have been reported in Syston Town and Thurmaston shopping centre where youths are being disruptive	Patrols have continued at key locations of Thurmaston retail Park and the parks within Syston.
You have stated that speeding and road safety use remains a concern. This includes parking causing obstructions and vehicles being driven in an antisocial manner	We continue to provide high visibility patrols and have liaised with partner agencies to deploy a camera car at areas raised as a concern. Speed checks were conducted on Melton Road Queniborough.
You have raised concerns regarding people using and dealing drugs.	A patch walk with housing has been conducted at an area of concern. We continue to gather information regarding drug related concerns








