On Monday 3rd June, Saltash neighbourhood team assisted by Saltash Professional Development Unit and J Section Force Support Group executed a Section 23 MUDA 1971 warrant at a property. An arrest was made upon entry and search, after a quantity of drugs and offensive weapons located.

We would like to thank the public for their patience and information that they have supplied to the police in order to help swear a warrant from the courts. The information you provide is recorded and is used in specific ways. We apologise for any inconvenience caused on the day.

On Friday evening (7 June), we were joined by Police Dog Skye, her handler PC Steve Waters, Licencing Officer Nicola Henderson, and plain clothes officers to carry out a Pubs Against Drugs (PAD) operation in seven licenced premises across Saltash and Liskeard.

This was a proactive operation to deter members of the public from using, carrying, or supplying drugs on a night out, educating members of the public about the legal and personal consequences around carrying and using illegal drugs, and to support local licenced premises to reinforce the law. By carrying out operations like this, local drug networks become disrupted, and we can gather evidence to identify, investigate and prosecute offenders. PD Skye successfully identified the presence of illegal drugs on multiple people. The evening of action resulted in...

- 👉 Seven people stop searched, with three of those being positive searches
- 🔴 Four items being seized, including suspected drug packages and alcohol being consumed by underage individuals
- 🚻 Eight toilets out of the 14 tested using drug wipes were found to contain positive traces of drugs

Sergeant Dan Lewis said: "We will continue to work with local businesses, licenced premises, communities, and our partner agencies to tackle drug use and supply. We urge members of the public to share any information with us concerning illegal drugs to support our commitment to making our communities safer."

has been reported to court and the vehicle seized [#NoExcuse](#) [@TruroPol](#)



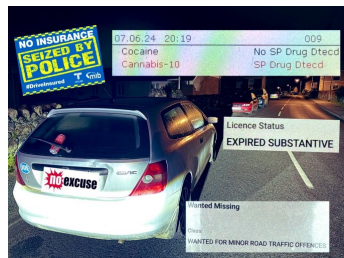

VW stopped in **#Wadebridge** - uninsured, notified off road for 'tax', positive drugs test for

cannabis which was also found in the van - driver arrested and vehicle seized [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)



Report of a cloned vehicle in **#Wadebridge** last night - located parked up with a suspect walking away - turned out to be a

stolen vehicle from [@metpoliceuk](#) in March - suspect tested +ve for cocaine, had drugs in his possession and later failed to provide blood in custody [#NoExcuse](#)



Van driver stopped earlier near **#StAustell** - driving using a mobile phone when driving is your job you should know better



#Audi stopped in **#Penryn** - uninsured, expired MOT and VEL - driver also tested positive for cannabis and

cocaine. Vehicle seized and driver arrested [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#) [#NoInsuranceNoCar](#) [@FalmouthPolice](#)



Some erratic driving in **#Wadebridge** last night caused us to stop this Corsa - driver clearly
