It's currently **illegal** to ride a **privately owned e-scooter** in any **public place**

Why is this?

.....

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs) so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as tax and insurance.

The current law is clear

You can buy one but it is illegal to use a PRIVATELY OWNED e-scooter in ANY public space including roads, pavements, parks, town centres or canal towpaths for example. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land.

What will happen if I'm stopped by Warwickshire Police?

If you ride an e-scooter on public land and roads you need to comply with a number of conditions including having appropriate insurance. Warwickshire Police has the power to seize e-scooters if you do not have insurance and to prosecute riders – please make sure you keep your privately owned e-scooter on private land so this doesn't happen to you.

Concern that a vulnerable adult was being scammed was reported by shopkeeper and followed up. Road traffic collisions. Escaped animals, sheep and horses and fallen trees on the road. Several road traffic incidents involving injuring or killing deer and significant damage vehicle. False alarms from to personal attack/protection devices. 999 calls. Reports Silent of suspected drug dealing. Reports of suspicious vehicles, vehicles being driven erratically and abandoned vehicles.

This newsletter is not intended to record a comprehensive list of every reported crime in the area but includes crimes and incidents that the local community should be aware of. Staying vigilant and working together with the police and your local community can help to keep crime out of your area. November's newsletter was downloaded by 635 people, mostly through local Facebook groups and our Facebook page, shared on Warwickshire Connected, Wellesbourne Neighbourhood Watch and also distributed across our SNT area by the team.
