Knife robberies fall under dedicated new taskforce

Knife robberies have dropped following targeted police action in the highest risk areas, as part of the Plan for Change.

Communities hit hardest by knife crime have seen a drop in offences and more weapons removed from streets, thanks to government and police action and the Plan for Change.

The number of robberies involving a knife – or the threat of one – have dropped after months of targeted police action in the seven highest risk areas, according to new data published by government today.

After seeing a stark rise in knife-enabled robbery in the year to June 2024, driven by a 14% increase across seven police forces, the Home Secretary set up a dedicated police taskforce last October and after just nine months of activity, there has been a 6% overall annual reduction compared with the previous year across those highest risk areas – with places like West Midlands seeing a substantial annual drop of 25%.

The reduction has been driven by intense police efforts and a range of tactics, including upping visible patrols, using drones, knife arches and detection dogs to support police on the ground, and deploying plain clothes officers.

Ninja Knife Ban

This July, the government ran a surrender scheme to offer safe disposal of ninja swords at designated police stations, ahead of the ban which comes into effect on 1 August.

The ban is the first part of the Government's manifesto commitment to introduce Ronan's Law, and latest step under the pledge to halve knife crime in the next decade. Ahead of the ban, at least a thousand deadly weapons were handed in.

The Home Office developed this scheme with members of the Coalition to Tackle Knife Crime to provide a broader range of ways the public could surrender weapons outside of police stations.

As part of the broader knife surrender scheme, Faron Paul of the charity FazAmnesty, drove a custom built and fully secure surrender van, across London, Greater Manchester and West Midlands. Words4Weapons supplied 37 new knife surrender bins.

When the weather is nice, everyone wants to be outside and enjoy the good weather. But crime rates tend to rise during the summer months, particularly in July and August. This increase is often attributed to factors like warmer weather, school holidays, and more people being outdoors.

In July the Home Office announced that shoppers and businesses will see increased police presence, stronger prevention and enforcement action by police and councils to support safer high streets this summer. Here's some pointers for how you can keep yourself safe too.

Street harassment

The first rule is to prioritise your personal safety. Do not challenge harassers if they are threatening or you believe they may cause harm to you.

If you see someone experience street harassment, and it is safe to do so, ask them 'are you ok?'. It can make a big difference to those who experience harassment by letting them know you stand by them, and that street harassment is never okay. Find out more about how to intervene on our website.

Phone theft

Analysis shows phone theft claims in UK have risen by 425% since 2021. The best insurance is preparation and prevention. The Metropolitan Police advise using your phone for the shortest possible time on the street and avoid texting while walking. Criminals often use bikes or mopeds when snatching devices, so watch out for any nearby when using your phone and stand away from the roadside.

Keep your phone physically secure. You can use phone cases with straps or lanyards that attach to your wrist to help keep you connected to your phone. They're not 100% secure, but may act as a deterrent.

Switch on your phone's security features to protect your phone and use the keypad lock so that thieves cannot immediately access your phone, or use the biometric authentication if your phone has it (finger print or facial recognition).

Pickpockets

Pickpockets don't always operate alone, they may work in teams to distract the target while someone unseen removes the items and blends back into the crowd. Another member might step in as an enforcer in the event of an altercation.

Add a note to the delivery instructions and request drivers to place packages in less visible spots, such as behind planters or gates.

Secure Delivery Options:



Require a signature:

For valuable items, request a signature upon delivery.



Alternative locations:

Direct packages to your workplace, a trusted neighbour, or a secure locker service (e.g., Amazon Locker).

Illuminate & Deter:

Motion-activated lighting around your entryway can startle and expose thieves operating under the cover of darkness.

Community Vigilance

Strengthen your Neighbourhood Watch. Inform neighbours about expected deliveries and offer to collect theirs. A united community is a powerful deterrent.

Dedicated Parcel Boxes:

Consider investing in a sturdy, lockable parcel box, securely fastened to your property, for safe package drop-offs.

VEHICLES

LOCK UP & DOUBLE CHECK

Before leaving your car or van unattended, double check that it is locked securely. Hide your belongings under a seat or lock them away in the glovebox or boot. Secure motorcycles to a fixed object with a heavy-duty lock.

Vehicle theft increasingly involves a property break-in for access to keys. Together, home and vehicle security are crucial for protecting your vehicle and its contents from theft.

SECURE YOUR KEYS

Keep your keys in a safe place, out of sight at all times. Burglars frequently steal keys from homes and simply drive away with the vehicle. Upgrading your home security can help to keep your vehicles safe too.

VISIBLE SECURITY

Steering wheel and handbrake locks are effective methods for protecting your vehicle from thieves. As well as providing an extra layer of security, they also act as a great visual deterrent.

ALARM, IMMOBILISER & TRACKER

Most modern vehicles come with a factory-fitted immobiliser, but adding a Thatcham-approved alarm can further reduce the risk of theft. Fitting a tracking device won't prevent a vehicle from being stolen, but it can increase the chances of recovery.

INSURANCE

Make sure your insurance policy details are up to date and that you have the correct level of insurance required to cover your needs.

PARK SAFE

Where possible, park in a place that's well-lit and open to public view. Look for car parks that are covered by CCTV or patrolled by security. Thieves will be less likely to target your vehicle if they think they will be seen or disturbed.
