### What matters to you

#### **#YOU SAID, WE DID**

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a priority

We have seen an increase in Anti-Social Behaviour incidences particularly involving youths in Groby and Ratby this last month. Anti-Social Behaviour is dealt with very seriously within the Beat and investigations are ongoing to identify those involved and they will be dealt with in partnership with the Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council Anti-Social Behaviour Team.

You said: Road safety continues to be an issue

Officers from Market Bosworth Beat Team alongside the Rural Crime Team completed speed checks in Barlestone and Nailstone this month following reports from concerned residents due to speeding throughout the village. We are pleased to report that there was a small number of people driving over the speed limit, they were all spoken to and given words of advice. An interesting fact to come out this operation was that we found the majority of speeder to be local residents.

You said: Rural Crime is priority (Burglary)

Officers from the Rural Crime Team alongside Market Bosworth Beat Team recovered 4 Stolen Ifor Williams Group Trailers after they were stolen the night before. Some old fashioned Police work and excellent team work led to an estimate of £12,000 worth of property being recovered .

## What we are doing

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in October 2023.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Conduct speed checks throughout areas that are known to have a high volume of traffic.(Barlestone and Nailstone)

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Conduct patrols of key areas reported to us, deal with offender through a multiple agency approach.

Your local beat team have teamed up with the Rural Crime team to conduct a pre-planned pro-active Operation across the beat area. During today's shift we have been busy with the following:

- Following concerns raised in relation to speeding vehicles in the villages of Nailstone and Barlestone. We have been able to conduct two separate Speed Operations at these locations. Grange Road, Nailstone and Barton Road, Barlestone were the chosen areas.
- Interestingly, after speaking with several speeding vehicles, it was identified that a large percentage were in fact residents of the villages. An important message to continue to enforce, that speed limits are there for a reason, particularly when the location is that of a Primary School.
- An opportunity arose to go into the Barlestone Primary school to discuss the concerns in relation to speeding vehicles and cars parking on grass verges, on zig-zag markings and obstructing pavements. Working together with the school and the local council to continue to monitor this.
- Following a stop check in Twycross, a vehicle was identified as having NO MOT and NO INSURANCE. As a result, the vehicle was seized, and a ticket issued for the offence.
- Staff were engaged with at Twycross Zoo whilst in the location. An important part of ongoing community engagement with businesses on the beat.
- Obstruction caused on the A447 was reported, after identifying the owners of the vehicles causing the obstruction, work is now under way to resolve the issue.
- The Road Safety Partnerships speed enforcement vehicle has been out in Stapleton and Cadeby throughout this afternoon. Further emphasising the focus on speeding vehicles throughout the beat area.
- An incident reported of debris on the A50 between Markfield & Groby was attended to ensure passing vehicles were not impacted, the road was cleared as a result.
