## Neighbourhood Watch supports Knife Crime Awareness Week

As an organisation dedicated to creating safer neighbourhoods, Neighbourhood Watch believes that education and community engagement are key to preventing knife crime.

Across the country, charities, police forces, youth professionals, parents, carers, and individuals are making a tangible difference in the lives of young people. We supported Knife Crime Awareness Week, which ran from 19 -25 May, providing a national platform to recognise and celebrate these efforts.

Knife crime in England and Wales has increased in recent years, over 50,500 offences were recorded in the year ending March 2024. #### **Congratulations Park Hall Neighbourhood Watch**

Park Hall Area Neighbourhood Watch (PHANW) has received a £2,500 donation from Midland Motor Fuels, operators of a Nisa Local store in Walsall.

The funding will support PHANW's efforts to enhance community safety and wellbeing across the Park Hall area. Plans include increasing visibility of the group through the installation of new Neighbourhood Watch signs and providing essential safety items, such as torches, to vulnerable residents.

The group also aims to improve road safety by enhancing lighting in key areas and supplying blind spot mirrors, as well as offering first aid training to local residents to help build resilience in emergency situations.

#### Be observant and report concerns:


Remember, Neighbourhood Watch is all about being our eyes and ears. If you see something that doesn't feel right, don't hesitate to report it or share information within your local watch group.

## **Policy update**

## Police to crush e-scooters and off-road bikes used anti-socially within 48 hours

Communities blighted by off-road biking in public parks, and intimidating street racing are set to benefit from new police powers to crack down on anti-social behaviour.

Anti-social drivers face having their cars, e-scooters or off-road bikes seized and destroyed after 48 hours under stronger powers proposed by the government.

Currently, police must wait 14 days before being able to dispose of a vehicle, making it easier for offenders to reclaim their vehicles and with a limited deterrent to repeat offending.

The measure to fast-track the disposal of vehicles comes alongside additional proposals to give police stronger powers to seize any vehicles involved in antisocial behaviour, with officers no longer required to issue a warning.

The changes are expected to have a wider impact on tackling more serious crime with e-scooters and e-bikes often used to facilitate drug dealing, organised acquisitive crime and serious violence. Find out more on our site.
