Finally with the colder and wetter weather approaching be sure to check your vehicles as when the weather changes a number of lights tend to fail when a small amount of moisture gets in. The other tip I will give is despite the temptation to leave your vehicles running in the morning to defrost please don't as they become easy targets for thieves.

Please also remember to lock your vehicle at night as less daylight give opportunist thieves more opportunities to attack your vehicles.

Look out for community events in your area a number of which I will attend and it will be lovely to meet you.

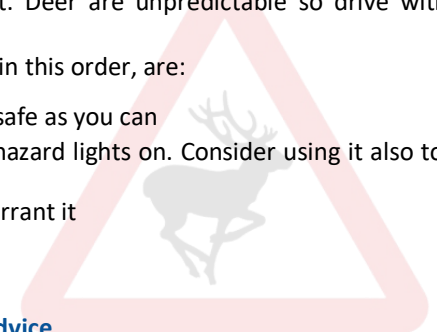
We have received several reports of incidents involving collisions with deer. Deer cross the road all year round but October to November is a peak time when deer will be on the move for the autumn mating season. Take particular care at dawn and dusk.

If a deer crosses in front of your vehicle, it is likely that another will follow. If it is safe to do so, slow right down or stop and wait. Deer are unpredictable so drive with caution.

If you hit a deer while driving, your priorities, in this order, are:

- ◆ Keep yourself and anyone with you as safe as you can
- ◆ Park your car in the safest place with hazard lights on. Consider using it also to warn other road users
- ◆ Call an ambulance if human injuries warrant it
- ◆ Call the Police (101)

BONFIRE NIGHT

REMEMBER! REMEMBER!

- X** It is illegal to sell fireworks to anyone under 18 years of age. Maximum penalty of £5000 and/or six months in prison.
- X** It is illegal to set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am (Bonfire night extended until 12 midnight).
- X** It is illegal to let off any firework in a public place and this carries a fine of up to £5000. Police may also issue an £90 Fixed Penalty Notice.
- X** All fireworks sold to the public must comply to British Safety Standard BS 7114.
- X** The police have the power to stop and search anyone suspected of carrying fireworks.
- X** The sale of banger, mini rockets, fireworks that fly erratically (squibs, helicopters etc), aerial shells and maroons is illegal.
- X** Irresponsible use of fireworks can damage property, cause injury, scare people (particularly the elderly) and frighten animals.

291-02/10 Church Road, Gaydon

Theft of used cooking oil that had been put out for collection by a recycling company.

362-20/10 Fosse Way, Combrook

Report of a deer being hit and injured by informant's car.

146-22/10 Geden Close, Kineton

Theft of a used tumble drier that had been put out for pre-arranged scrap collection.

Burton Dassett area

316-15/10 Warmington

Theft of used and unused cooking oil. Offenders reported to be in a white transit van.

164-22/10 Mollington Lane, Warmington

Horse and fencing related items stolen from shed.

380-29/10 Burton Dassett Country Park

Report of a group setting off fireworks and deliberately aiming them at other cars.

Snitterfield Area:
